This is our final push to gather 'before winter' so we can be prepared to make it through the next year. Proverbs 6:7-8 tells us ants have "no captain, overseer or ruler, yet they gather their food during the harvest and it lasts them until the next summer." What's Happened in the Region (just in November!)

God continues to bless this work and use his people. This week our ladies went into the downtown Nueces County jail location and baptized 21 women! Next Tuesday, at the McKenzie Annex County jail location in Nueces County we are scheduled to baptize 22 men! This has been a continuing pattern since early July that each week we have been blessed to be baptizing new disciples into Christ. Since July, more than 300 souls have been baptized into Christ in the Nueces County jails and TDCJ half-way house at CoreCivic in Corpus Christi.

What's Happened around Texas (just in November!)

Dr. Dale Underwood traveled to the Valley to visit with the chaplain at the Glossbrenner TDCJ Unit in San Diego and then chaplains in Edinburg at the Lopez and Segovia units. All of these chaplains are anxious to have our teams return to teaching since COVID. We are scheduling now to begin in January, 2023! Please pray for **Charles Barber** and **Mike DeShazo** as they prepare to go into the Glossbrenner unit to teach with us. Please pray for **John Gannaway** and his team as he prepares to go into the Lopez unit in Edinburg.
