Pat Watson's class will focus on NewLife groups and demonstrate some of the engaging tools that make these such uplifting support groups.


**Recardo Reyes** will speak to Spanish efforts and the exciting new Gideon Project.

God continues to send workers into the field. Benjamin Rodriguez (pictured left) is a brother in Christ who will be joining the effort to reach the lost in prisons. Brother Ben is in the San Antonio area and will be working with other volunteers to reach prisoners with the gospel in the Dominguez prison unit in San Antonio as well as the Torres and Joe Nev prison units in Hondo. Ben is quick to tell you that many years ago he was in prison and because of exposure to volunteers willing to go into prisons and the NewLife Behavior curriculum, he is a baptized believer who is ready to teach others about Jesus.

Have you considered the wisdom of Jesus when he sent his disciples out in two's? According to Mark 6:7, Jesus sent his disciples out "two by two". In effect, this cut in half the number of towns in which the ministry of the kingdom could be happening simultaneously. In addition, Jewish law required there be at least two witnesses to resolve a matter. And, there is power in shared ministry, the added impact when two or more people working together toward a shared goal is encouraging.

John Henry Pruitt, (pictured right) a beloved figure at the Kings Crossing Church of Christ and in this prison ministry work, continues to impact lives for Christ even after his death. We recently received this email from one of our partners in ministry, Timothy Hall, in Johnson City, Tennessee.

"Last night in class # 13 of our "Christians Against Substance Abuse" class at Northeast Correctional Complex, Mario Carroll (pictured below with minister, Tim Hall) presented for his table. He had all the men at his table stand with him (except for the one who is wheelchair bound). Toward the end of his presentation he said, "Rest in peace. John Henry Pruitt. We're thankful for his work in the prisons, and especially for training Marshall Danby to do prison work, and for his work in training Tim White and Tim Hall."

You see, the prison ministry team in Johnson City gives out the tract written by John Henry that he wrote a few years ago entitle "What Keeps Me Free" at the start of their studies. Hall continued to say, "He (Mario Carroll) has come a mighty long way in his new life and was baptized in June of 2022." John Henry Pruitt's story continues to be an example of how God can impact others through you.
