Every Christian Ought to Have a Choice

Upon learning of the ripe mission field called *jails and prisons*, folks often respond hot or cold. After giving it more thought, some "warm up." The difficulty lies in presenting the option. Some church

leaders are not eager for members to hear about it, but nothing erases Jesus' words, "I was in prison, and you came to me" (Matthew 25:36).

It is more difficult to persuade a congregation than individual Christians to get behind prison ministry. And if it is supported by the church, the amount is less than what members want. If given the choice to seek individual versus congregational support, I always prefer taking the case straight to members. Even if a congregation agrees to support us, they write smaller checks than members. Plus, in a few years the church gets bored and switches support to some other effort. Individual members, on the other hand, keep on giving in growing amounts until they die and leave something to prison ministry in their Will!

I have always believed that prison ministry could receive all we need IF we could find a way to present it to every Christian! We receive generous gifts from Christians grieved by home congregations saying "no" to visiting Jesus in prison. But, if the congregation refuses, informed Christians will.



Prison ministry battles for time and attention. Jerry Stephenson (minister and elder at Midwest Church of Christ in Louisville, Kentucky) calls Prison Ministry "the *best-known secret* in churches of Christ!"

Why? The answer is a lack of education and misinformation. Marie Curie has written, "Nothing in life is to be feared; it is only to be understood. Now is the time to understand more, so that we may fear less." We cannot educate unless given a chance. A lack of knowledge leads some to think we are *bleeding hearts* and only want to turn criminals loose. How sad. Our desire is to see captive souls set free by the same blood that cleansed and made us whole. We seize openings to tell a congregation or individuals how they can "visit Jesus in prison" in 2021.
